
The event highlights all of the accomplishments of our county 4-H Horse Program. Recognition is given to members for a variety of accomplishments. Members

# STEM & AG IN THE CLASSROOM

### **4-H Educators Provide Programs to Rochester City Schools**

Extension 4-H educators began visits to first grade classes at School 17 to provide STEM programming.


We had a very messy first lesson of Oobleck, of which the main ingredient is corn starch. We read about Oobleck and students moved like Oobleck. - Susan Coyle, 4-H Educator

A mixture of cornstarch and water, Oobleck has properties of both solids and liquids. You can slowly dip your hand into it like a liquid, but if you squeeze the Oobleck or punch it, it will feel solid.



School 25 program (4-H Staff) The Garden Club at School 25 is learning indoors for the winter. Using virtual reality (VR) headsets, these sixth grade students visited a dairy farm, climbed Mt. Everest and hiked in a national park.







Kindergarteners & first graders with the YMCA after-school program at School 8 received their first lesson in animal science. They learned about farm animals and the terms used for the male, female and offspring of each. The program concluded with a stretch and a song.

#### PHEASANT PROGRAM VISION

To meet the current and future needs of people for pheasant hunting, observation, and educational opportunities within biological constraints and consistent with available funding.

#### **KEY PROGRAM POINTS**

- The DEC distributes 60,000 or more day-old chicks annually.
- Anyone can apply to participate in the Day-old Pheasant Chick Program.
- Participants must have the appropriate brooding facility and outdoor rearing pen.
- Release sites must be open to public pheasant hunting.
- Birds may not to be released on private shooting preserves.
- Applications for chicks must be submitted by March 22<sup>nd</sup>.
- Participants must become familiar with Day-old Pheasant Chick Program guide.
- Day-old pheasant chicks are provided to participants in April, May, or June.
- Pheasants must be released at eight weeks of age or older, but no later than end of the pheasant hunting season.
- Pheasants provided to participants may not be bought, sold or traded.

### 2019 New York Farm Bureau Agricultural Youth Scholarship Information



### **Applicant Guidelines:**

- 2019 graduating high school seniors who will continue their education to prepare for a career in some way connected to the diverse agricultural industry
- Live or work on a farm or be involved with agriculture via any avenue
- Family Farm Bureau membership or student Farm Bureau membership is required and may accompany application

### **Process and Procedure:**

- Applications and information available at www.nyfb.org or by calling 1-800-342-4143
- Students are required to complete an application which is a fillable pdf available on the NYFB website and submit a brief 300-500 word essay discussing an issue facing agriculture in their county, explaining how they think NYFB can support members who may deal with this issue
- Completed application packets must be returned to New York Farm Bureau in Albany. March 1, 2019 postmark deadline or via email.

A District level competition will be held. The judging will take place prior to April 20, 2019. Each District winner will receive \$100 plus a memento of their selection.

State winner selection will be made from District winners, based solely on the submitted applications; there will be no personal interviews.

#### \$1500, \$1200, and \$1000 Scholarships will be awarded.



#### **Types of Presentations**

- **CLOVERBUDS:** 1-3 minutes. "Show & Tell." Use of a visual (poster/prop) is recommended.
- **ILLUSTRATED TALK:** Use visual aids to talk about a topic. Recommended for beginners. Good for all ages.
- **DEMONSTRATION:** Show how to do or make something. Recommended for beginners. Good for all ages.
- **SPEECH:** Deliver an original speech intended to persuade, motivate, or inform the audience. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demonstrations & Illustrated Talks.
- **DRAMATIC INTERPRETATION:** Re-enact a piece of scripted materials individually or in a team. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demon- strations & Illustrated Talks.
- **RECITATION:** Recite a pre-written work using vocal inflectation & body language. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demonstrations & Illustrated Talks.
- **IMPROMPTU:** Ready for a challenge?! Pull a topic from a hat & use 20 minutes to prepare a presentation. Great choice for ages 13+ who have at least 2 years of experience in Public Presentations.
