Types of Presentations

- **CLOVERBUDS:** 1-3 minutes. "Show & Tell." Use of a visual (poster/prop) is recommended.
- **ILLUSTRATED TALK:** Use visual aids to talk about a topic. Recommended for beginners. Good for all ages.
- **DEMONSTRATION:** Show how to do or make something. Recommended for beginners. Good for all ages.
- **SPEECH:** Deliver an original speech intended to persuade, motivate, or inform the audience. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demonstrations & Illustrated Talks.
- **DRAMATIC INTERPRETATION:** Re-enact a piece of scripted materials individually or in a team. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demon- strations & Illustrated Talks.
- **RECITATION:** Recite a pre-written work using vocal inflectation & body language. Good choice for ages 12+ who have done Demonstrations & Illustrated Talks.
- **IMPROMPTU:** Ready for a challenge?! Pull a topic from a hat & use 20 minutes to prepare a presentation. Great choice for ages 13+ who have at least 2 years of experience in Public Presentations.

STEM & AG IN THE CLASSROOM

Monroe County Second Graders Discover Conifers

Extension 4-H Educator Jessica Reid visited several second grade classrooms at RCSD's School 8 and Webster's Plank Road North to talk about conifers, as part of the New York State Ag in the Classroom program. Students learned how to identify different conifers, becoming "Conifer Detectives" to determine whether samples were pine, spruce, fir, or hemlock. Students also tried their hand at "conifer painting", discovering the different textures of various conifers by using the branches and needles as paintbrushes.

Coming Up in January...

Plant Tops and Bottoms

You may already know that carrots are roots, but did you know that broccoli is a flower? Students will explore the major parts of plants where we get our food—roots, stems, leaves, flowers and fruits! Using the story "Plants Tops and Bottoms" by Janet Stevens, students will learn to distinguish if certain foods we eat are produced on the top or bottom of a plant, and identify where fruits and vegetables belong on a MyPlate diagram. At the end of this lesson, students will be able to list several delicious and healthy "tops", "middles", and "bottoms" to eat! *There is a \$5 Supply Fee per classroom

2019 New York Farm Bureau Agricultural Youth Scholarship Information



Applicant Guidelines:

- 2020 graduating high school seniors who will continue their education to prepare for a career in some way connected to the diverse agricultural industry.
- Live or work on a farm or be involved with agriculture via any avenue.
- Family Farm Bureau membership or student Farm Bureau membership is required and may accompany application.

Process and Procedure:

- Applications and information available at www.nyfb.org or by calling 1-800-342-4143
- Students are required to complete an application which is a fillable pdf available on the NYFB website and submit a brief 300-500 word essay discussing an issue facing agriculture in their county, explaining how they think NYFB can support members who may deal with this issue
- Completed application packets must be returned to New York Farm Bureau in Albany. March 1, 2020 postmark deadline or via email.

A District level competition will be held. The judging will take place prior to April 20, 2020. Each District winner will receive \$100 plus a memento of their selection.

State winner selection will be made from District winners, based solely on the submitted applications; there will be no personal interviews.

\$1500, \$1200, and \$1000 Scholarships will be awarded.
