# 4-H Believes in Connecting Kids to Agriculture AGRICULTURAL LITERACY WEEK 2020

A successful collaboration between Monroe County Farm Bureau, Monroe County 4-H, and New York State Agriculture in the Classroom allows Monroe County second graders to participate in the nation-wide event known as Agricultural Literacy Week. The event includes a book reading and an educational, hands-on activity that helps to connect agriculture facts to second grade students.

The program is executed by having volunteers read aloud the chosen story for the year. The 2020 book is called "Right This Very Minute: a table-to-farm book" by Lisl H. Detlesen. Agricultural Literacy Week is March 16 - 20.

The book demonstrates how the food we serve on the dining room table goes through an entire process called food production before entering the doors of the home. Most often, the concept of a farm is animals such as horses, pigs, and chickens, and large colorful fields. The components discussed within the book explain how farmers plant, grow, harvest, transport and process the product. Usually, consumers do not think

a lot about what goes into how vegetables and meat are harvested and produced by farm workers in order to provide healthy, naturally grown crops, meat, and dairy products to their families.

You may support this educational program by registering as a volunteer to read, be present for support, or encourage new members of the community to volunteer. In lieu of volunteering, you have the option to help by sponsoring a book to a specific second grade class or let the 4-H team choose where the book will be placed. Regardless, if you volunteer or donate a book, the goal is to educate community youth and be part of a successful event. Youth are the future of our communities, so the hope is that the positive impact will be long-term.

#### 2020 Agricultural Literacy Week Monday, March 16 through Friday, March 20

Now in its 15th Year, Agricultural Literacy Week has helped to bring agriculturally themed books and resources into thousands of classrooms and libraries throughout New York State.

In celebration of New York agriculture, the Monroe County 4-H team will read a book with an agricultural theme to youth of all ages. Attendees will also benefit from hands-on activities.

#### How Does Agricultural Literacy Week (ALW) Work?

The book will be donated to the school or classroom library with a bookplate recognizing the donor and NY Agricultural Literacy Week. 2,300 books were donated last year while 75,000 elementary students participated in an experiential learning activity.

#### **April 2020**

The Cycle of Water (Grades K-6) Cost per classroom: FREE

Water is vital to survival on earth. Youth learn about the water cycle by using beads to follow the journey of water as vapor, in clouds, as rain and more. Program duration is 30-45 minutes.

#### May 2020

#### Seed Germination (Grades K to 8)

Cost per classroom: \$5

Seeds come to life through germination. Students will make a seed germination necklace and use their body heat to help a seed germinate. Youth will learn the parts of a seed and what they need to germinate. For older students we can delve into photosynthesis and the structures of the new plant! Program duration is 30-45 minutes.





#### June 2020

The Buzz About Bees (Grades K-6) Cost per classroom: FREE

Create a "buzz" in your classroom this June with 4-H Ag in the Classroom! Your students will learn all about bees in this fun, hands-on lesson. Students will learn to identify bees that can be found in their neighborhood, and try their hand at becoming pollinators, as they discover how bees play a crucial role in our local agriculture and ecosystem. Program duration is 30-45 minutes.

#### **Plant Tops and Bottoms**



You may already know that carrots are roots, but did you know that broccoli is a flower? Students will explore the major parts of plants where we get our food—roots, stems, leaves, flowers and

Using the story "Plants Tops and Bottoms" by Janet Stevens, students will learn to distinguish if certain foods we eat are produced on the top or bottom of a plant, and identify where fruits and vegetables belong on a MyPlate diagram. At the end of this lesson, students will be able to list several delicious and healthy "tops", "middles", and "bottoms" to eat!



## **Helmet Safety and Concussion Awareness: New Policies for NYS 4-H Horse Programs**

#### NYS 4-H Concussion policy (effective October 1, 2019):

All 4-H events with driving or mounted riding must have at least one staff member or volunteer present

who has successfully completed the Heads Up Online Training (CDC). THE TRAINING NEEDS TO BE COMPLETED FOR DRIVING OR RIDING EVENTS.

Concussions, or Traumatic Brain Injuries (TBIs), are an unfortunate risk of equestrian activities. According to a 2016 study (Winkler et al. 2016), equestrian sports were the leading cause of sports-related traumatic brain injuries. To minimize the potential consequences of a fall or injury, you can educate yourself and others about helmet safety, concussion detection, and safe horse handling and riding.


