Come to the New York State Fair! This year, the New York State Fair runs from Thursday, August 25 through Labor Day—Monday, September 5.

For 12 days, youth from around New York are invited to attend Fair as representatives of their county Cooperative Extension and 4-H offices. The 4-H Youth Building is located near Gate 4 close to Indian Village and the birthing barn.

The Fair highlights the best of 4-H, positive youth development, and New York itself through a focus on agriculture and animal care, public presentations, renewable energy, health and fitness, robotics, teen leadership, and more!

State Fair affords youth in 4-H with opportunities to display exhibits or offer presentations that demonstrate what they have learned, enhance individual learning and skill development, receive

recognition or participate in invitationals based on county or district achievement, learn and recognize standards of quality, learn and apply research-based subject matter, promote public awareness of the 4-H Youth Development program, and have fun!


